



## Adult Speech Pathology Service Fact Sheet

## What we do

Speech Pathologists (sometimes known as Speech Therapists) have a wide and varied role when working with adult clients. They support adults who have speech, language, communication and swallowing problems resulting from developmental conditions such as intellectual disability, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Down Syndrome and Cerebral Palsy.

Speech Pathologists also work with adults with communication and swallowing difficulties as a result of medical conditions, such as stroke, head and neck cancer, Parkinson's disease and dementia.

Therapists work with individual clients and also with the client's support team which may include family, friends, support workers, employers and other Allied Health and medical professionals, to provide tailored treatment programs to address each client's communication and swallowing needs.

## How we can help

A Speech Pathologist can support clients by:

- Providing an assessment of a client's communication skills, including their understanding of others and the ways they express themselves;
- Providing assessment and management plans to support positive and safe mealtimes;
- Developing the communication skills of those working with and supporting clients, including training in simple language, Key Word Sign, visual aids and other Augmentative & Alternative Communication (AAC) systems;
- Promoting a communication-friendly environment, ensuring information is presented in a way that clients can understand:
- Working with clients directly to provide targeted therapy to address their communication and swallowing difficulties; and
- Trialling different AAC options to support clients to understand others, make choices, communicate and participate fully in their everyday lives
